Leopard 101	Mac OS X Support Essentials v10.5	3 Days	Aug 26 – 28	
Mac OS X Support Essentials is a three-day, hands-on course that provides an in-depth exploration of troubleshooting on Mac OS X. This course is designed to give you a tour of the breadth of functionality of Mac OS X and the best methods for effectively supporting users of Mac OS X systems.				
Leopard 201	Mac OS X Server Essentials v10.5	4 Days	Sep 15 – 18	
Mac OS X Server Essentials is a four-day course designed to give technical coordinators and entry-level system administrators the skills, tools, and knowledge to implement and maintain a network that uses Mac OS X Server. Students learn how to install and configure Mac OS X Server to provide network-based services, such as file sharing, authentication, and printing. Tools for efficiently managing and deploying Mac OS X and software updates are also covered.				
Leopard 301	Mac OS X Directory Services v10.5	4 Days	Jul 21 – 24	Oct 27 – 30
This four-day course focuses on both Mac OS X as a directory service client, and Mac OS X Server as a directory server. Cross platform solutions are emphasized in both instances. In working with Mac OS X, students learn how to use network accounts and Kerberos authentication with any common directory service, such as Apple's Open Directory, Microsoft's Active Directory, or an industry-standard LDAP server.				
Leopard 302	Mac OS X Deployment v10.5	3 Days	Aug 19 – 21	
This three-day course focuses on solutions for deploying software, ranging from the installation of individual files to the deployment of complete system images to multiple computers. Students then apply what they've learned to create a full deployment plan that includes testing, hardware and software deployment, auditing and maintenance.				
Leopard 401	Mac OS X Advanced System Administration v10.5	5 Days	Schedule on Demand	
This five-day course builds on the foundations established in the Support Essentials v10.5 and Server Essentials v10.5 courses and is designed to empower students to meet the challenges faced by administrators deploying Mac OS X and Mac OS X Server in today's complex and dynamic data centers. Extensive use of the command line interface reveals a deeper scope of the course's subject material. Students learn how to become more efficient by taking advantage of the wide variety of automation technologies built into Mac OS X and Mac OS X Server. They also gain valuable problem-solving experience by using proven and effective troubleshooting methodologies.
